"And now, Father, send us out to do the work you have given us to do, to love and serve you as faithful witnesses of Christ our Lord." (Book of Common Prayer, p. 366)

These words from the post-communion prayer set the standard for us in the post-Easter Church. The great fifty day celebration of Easter has passed and the work of ministry has begun. Quakers have good saying about our use of the word "service" when we mean "worship." They say, "The service begins when the worship ends." Our Sunday morning is devoted to the worship of God, not service in God's name. Service is our purpose Monday through Saturday.



As baptized Christians, we are sent out as ministers of the Gospel each day. Our message is simple. We are all God's children. Love created us, nourishes us and heals the wounds we inflict on others (and ourselves). The God of abundance has given us everything we need to have a life that overflows with blessing upon blessing. And God is always here, among us, to guide us toward God's dream of a world where "want" is no longer a word because justice ensures there is enough and each and every person is afforded the dignity, respect and forbearance that we all wish for.

So, put your hand to the plow and do not look back. (Luke 9:62) Take your place as a shareholder, a partner in Christ's ministry to reconcile the world to God's ways, God's values, for all human beings to live fully and in harmony with one another. The Prophet Isaiah tells us the ministry of the Messiah: "The spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me, because the LORD has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners..." (61:1). Jesus confirms this in the Gospel according to Matthew: "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them" (11:4-5).

We are sent out as "faithful witnesses" to this ministry, to carry it on in Jesus' name. In the New Testament James and the First letter of John tell us what it means to be "faithful." James writes, "If a brother or sister is naked and lacks daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and eat your fill," and yet you do not supply their bodily needs, what is the good of that? So faith by itself, if it has no works, is dead (2:15-17)." In the First Letter of John, it is written, "How does God's love abide in anyone who has the world's goods and sees a brother or sister in need and yet refuses help? Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action." (3:17-18)

And so, with the power of the Spirit given to the Church at Pentecost, let us move outward beyond the limits of what we once thought possible and let the Spirit guide us toward what God dreams for us all.

#### St. Thomas' Episcopal Church

Vestry Meeting, May 17, 2016 Minutes

The Vestry and Rector of St. Thomas' met on Tuesday, May 17, 2016 at 6:00 PM in the Parish House. Present were Rob Outland, David Simons, Brenda Hewitt, Claudia Griffin, Mike Steczak (Junior Warden), Hugh Davis (Senior Warden), Ernie Carter (Treasurer), & Jeff Douglas (Rector). Absent were Fred Liverman, Patsy Jones, & Daniel McCamish (Clerk).

The Rector called the meeting to order at 6:02 PM and opened the meeting with prayer.

**Prior Minutes**. The minutes of the April 19 meeting were reviewed and approved.

**Treasurer's Report.** The treasurer's report for April 2016 was read, reviewed, and approved. The Parish has submitted its Property Report to the Diocese. The parish does need to complete its 2015 Audit, as the church has already received an extension to complete and submit it.

**Service.** The **Soup Kitchen** for May will be held on Thursday, May 19 & 26. It will also be held in both June and July (a change from some earlier years). The **Medical Mission** is on target for its June 11-18 trip to the Dominican Republic. Members of the team will have an organizational meeting soon; the team is looking for old suitcases that can be used to help transport meds to those in need.

The Parish has received word from the **Ahoskie Food Pantry** that it is low on funds. This is an effect of growing need in the area and the growth of the Food Pantry's Backpack Ministry (now serving more than 200 children each week). The vestry moved to donate \$2,500 to the Food Pantry for their use.

**Worship.** In Jeff's absence, the parish will celebrate the rite of Morning Prayer on June 5, and the Rev. Bill Smyth will serve as supply for both the 8 and 10:30 services on June 12.

The service for **Rogation** on May 8 went well and saw a strong turnout from our peers at St. Mary's. Jeff reported that the Deanery Confirmation (held at Church of the Advent on May 15) went well. There will be an Albemarle Deanery-wide **Stop Hunger Now** event in the fall (likely held in Elizabeth City).

**Education.** The series on the Old Testament being viewed as a part of adult Sunday School has only six lectures to reach completion, so adult Sunday School will continue into the summer to complete it. All are welcome.

The church will plan a Youth Trip to DC this fall, including a visit to the (soon-to-open) African-American History Museum, the Holocaust Museum, and the National Cathedral.

**Pastoral Care.** The Rector addressed concerns about parishioners undergoing operations and reported on checking in with a parishioner who has been coping with both health issues and grief.

**Junior Warden's Report.** The Vestry discussed the ongoing plans to re-landscape the west side of the Parish Hall. Given the damage the shrubbery and growth have caused/are causing to the building, the growth needs to be removed, with excavation of the wall and repair completed (as necessary). The foundation will need to be water proofed, with the newly planted vegetation kept at least three feet from the building walls. A message

will be sent to the parish clarifying the upcoming work and allowing all to come pull from the garden as interested. The removal will be done after June 1.

Mike Steczak has completed several projects around the church, including installing an outlet in the Parish Hall to help with the ongoing project to install speakers, a projector, and screen into the PH and putting in a photocell for the lights at the office porch. The church has passed two of the issues raised by the fire marshal when he inspected and is working to resolve the final issue. The Bathrooms will be worked on for improvements. A question was raised about the cemetery plot on Braxton Britt's property. David Simons will make sure it is taken care of.

The Rector shared information about his rewarding experience at CREDO.

From the Senior Warden—



"Turn the World Around"

On Pentecost Sunday, Jeff reminded us about the need to be "a little crazy" and to perform such "crazy" acts as showing daily compassion and charity. Jeff's reference to the Presiding Bishop's idea of and call for some "Crazy Christians" further brought to mind the PB's sermon when he was installed into the leadership of our church. Both in that service and for our own Pentecostal celebration of the church's birthday, the congregations sang Marty Haugen's "All

Are Welcome," a hymn that reminds us, as we keep our doors open to all comers, that, in our church and in our lives, "the outcast and the stranger bear the image of God's face" in a call that we "bring an end to fear and danger." Certainly, Jeff and Michael are right that ending (or even alleviating) fear and danger—especially today, when the 24-hour news cycle repeatedly reveals stories of violence, warfare, and paranoia at a regular rate—will require unconventional thinking, a new approach, and some rather "Crazy Christians." Those actions will also help us all meet the charge Bishop Curry laid out that we "turn the world upside down."

That message and reminder—the call to be and demonstrate the true meaning of Christianity—further brought to mind for me a Harry Belafonte song, "Turn the World Around." Though there have been several covers of this number, the version I always think of comes from Belafonte's appearance on *The Muppet Show*. At St. Thomas', we all know and love Jim Henson (who is most definitely a hero of mine as well as one of the creative figures highlighted in the "Think Different" ads Jeff preached about on Whitsunday), and this song has often been named as his favorite from all of the powerful moments produced by the Muppets. Though it was featured in at least a pair of Muppet specials and even sung by Belafonte at Jim Henson's funeral, it most famously concluded the Muppet Show episode Belafonte hosted (and one I still remember watching when it premiered). The song began in the dressing room, as Belafonte was explaining the song's inspiration to Fozzie Bear. As he began to sing the song, solo and a cappella, specially-made puppets of African masks began appearing and joining in the song, and then the set dissolved into black, as Belafonte and the African Muppets sang of the circle and cycle of life. They were eventually joined by the regular Muppets, as the chorus grew and grew and reminded all of us that "we are of the spirit, truly of the spirit" and "only can the spirit turn the world around." This anthem for renewal and revolution reminds us all that "so is life" when we seek to turn the world around. It is the core of our nature; it just seems crazy at times to think it can be done. Asking "Do we know who we are?", Belafonte and the Muppets remind us of the need for every one of us to "see...one another clearly." With some clarity of vision, we can turn the world around, and that can start even as we start our summers. The Medical Mission team will do their part in the Dominican Republic, but, as Jeff preached specifically about on Pentecost and as we are reminded each time we gather to worship, the possibilities for change are always just around the corner. We also can start global change with local action.

Several of us have on our vehicles (but even more of us know in our minds and hearts) a slogan/bumper magnet for St. Thomas'. Its message reads simply: "Love God. Love Your Neighbor. Change the World." This summer seems like a good time to start. Let's get crazy.







