From the Vestry:

St. Thomas Episcopal Church Vestry Meeting, August 18, 2015 Minutes

The Vestry and Rector of St. Thomas met on Tuesday, August 18, 2015 at 6:00 p.m. in the Parish House. Present were the Rector, Jeff Douglas, the Treasurer, Ernie Carter, and Vestry members, Hugh Davis, Claudia Griffin, Fred Liverman, Daniel McCamish, Gretchen Simons, Mike Steczak, and Lindsay Vaughan.

The Rector opened the meeting with a prayer.

Prior Minutes. The minutes of the June 16th Vestry meeting were reviewed and approved with two minor corrections.

Treasurer's Report. The treasurer's report for June – July, 2015, was read and approved.

The Personnel Committee will consist of Steve Kelly, Lois Sawyer, Buck Suiter, Jeff Douglas, and Mike Steczak. Search has begun for a new Parish Secretary. A detailed job description was read and approved, along with a copy of the advertisement for the position.

A new cleaning service has been hired on a two-month trial basis: Mary Breeden began on August 1st. She is a housekeeping supervisor at Chowan University with years of experience, and comes highly recommended. The Vestry will consider whether to retain her permanently, at the September meeting.

The Soup Kitchen will be held on Thursday, August 20th and 27th.

Lobster Feast will be on Friday October 9th. Tickets are available now. Daniel McCamish has agreed to take over maintenance of the database of ticket sales. He will contact Linda Shotwell to get the list for initial ticket distribution, and work with her to learn the tracking system that has been used.

Changes have been made to the **Rental Agreement** for the Parish Hall. Weddings will not be allowed, nor will playground equipment such as inflatable bouncy rooms. A deposit will be collected to reserve the facility. Everyone will be charged a flat fee of \$125 for 4 hours. To prevent abuse of the kitchen, renters will only be allowed to use it to store food that has already been prepared.

The supply clergy who led worship services – The Rev. Elizabeth Webster on July 26^{th} and The Rt. Rev. David Bane, Jr. August 2^{nd} – did well.

Adult Sunday School begins on September 20th. Jeff will lead, with Carolyn Peele handling the second Sunday current events programs.

Plans are still forming for the **Children's Sunday School**. New instructors are needed, and we need to find out who will be attending.

Pastoral Care. The Rector has been visiting with several parishioners who are dealing with major health issues. It was mentioned that Stan and Tomma Jenkins and their family would appreciate visits and offers of help to run errands.

Jr. Warden's Report. A big thank-you was extended to Jamie Johnson and his crew for helping us over the summer with A/C, cleaning, mold removal, water spots in the ceiling, and much more.

As mentioned earlier, **Mary Breeden** has been hired on a two-month trial basis to do our cleaning. With 26 years of experience, and a full time supervisory position at Chowan, she does not need to be followed or micro-managed. It is recommended that if someone has a suggestion for her, they first speak with Jeff or Mike.

The locks in and around the Parish Hall have been re-keyed. New digital locks were installed in the Sacristy.

A new 50 gallon electric water heater has been purchased for \$525. We are waiting on the installers.

Yardwork projects will be postponed until after Lobster Feast. Several other maintenance items are in the works, as detailed in the Jr. Warden's Report.


